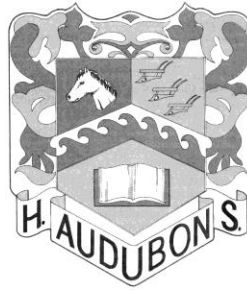

Dear Audubon High School Student:

Enclosed please find your PSAT/NMSQT Score Report and some information on how to interpret your scores. If you would like a copy of a test booklet, please visit the Student Personnel Services Office.

As we pointed out before the test, the **PSAT is strictly a practice test**. Colleges do not normally receive PSAT scores, but if you happen to share them with colleges, they are not to use them as part of the admissions evaluation when you apply for admission in your senior year. The only exceptions are related to those students who, by scoring at the very top of the range, may be considered for recognition by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation and/or the College Board. In the event that your scores are not as high as you had hoped, you have time to work on improving them before you take the SATs.

The score report provides an interpretation of your scores, along with information on the skills and courses needed to attain your educational and career objectives as you reported them in October. **Scores are reported on a scale from 160 to 760**; below your score is a score range that indicates how you might score were you to take the SAT.

In reviewing your results, you may want to give special attention to the percentile score. **Percentiles show how your scores compare with those students in your grade across the nation** who plan to attend college. For example, if your score places you at the 70th percentile, that means you performed as well as or better than 70 percent of the college-bound juniors who took the PSAT.

To prepare for the SAT, it is suggested that you use the test booklet and answer key provided on your score report to identify areas where you have strengths as well as areas where you might benefit from more preparation. In addition, you may link your collegeboard account to Khan Academy for free SAT prep.
